From the Principal

Gresham Barlow School District Bond

I know you have all received several communications from me about the Gresham Barlow School District Bond that is on the ballot. Please be sure to look over that information and the impact that 2.1 million dollars will have on the entire district. I encourage you to consider the following:

- Barlow will be receiving \$70,356,000 dollars for new construction and remodeling to improve our facility.
- Improvements will include 25 new classrooms, a covered stadium, major renovations of our auditorium, and the creation of common spaces for students where they can learn, study, and collaborate.
- All classrooms in our building will be improved in one way or another. This would include improvements such as paint, furnishings, technology, curriculum and other things to make student life and our learning environments more conducive for learning.
- Safety and security updates to limit the number of entrances, internally locking classroom doors, and emergency communication equipment.
- Expanded educational opportunities for all students.
- This is an opportunity to enhance all facilities in our district and to improve the learning environment for all students. Please be sure to vote.

Progress Reports

I am sure you have all received your student's six-week progress report in the mail. Whether this is a time for celebration or concern, please let your student know that you have seen their progress report. This is a great time to have a conversation about what has worked well, as well as what may need to be improved. No matter how a student has performed at this point, things can change, for the better or for the worse. I have often seen students who have done very well the first six-weeks "take a break" only to find that at 12-weeks, their grades have slipped. I have also seen students who have had poor grades turn on the juice and catch up. The key is talking to your student and engaging with them about their overall performance at school. If you need help having these conversations, please do not hesitate to contact your student's counselor. They are there to provide that assistance.

Parent Teacher Conferences

I wanted to personally invite all of you to our Parent Teacher Conferences that will be held in our gym on the evening of Tuesday, November 22 and the morning of Wednesday, November 23. This is a great opportunity to meet our staff, talk to teachers who work with your student, to learn about our programs, and to pick up your student's twelve-week grades. Sam Barlow's winter semi-formal dance is scheduled for Saturday, December 3, from 8-11 pm in the cafeteria. Dress for the dance is semi-formal, and a tuxedo is NOT required.

Parents, please remember that our young women need to wear dresses that are suitable for a school dance. It is awkward for our staff, and embarrassing to students, to have to approach a young woman wearing a dress that is too revealing the night of the dance. Sending a student home ruins everyone's night! Please help us ensure a pleasant evening for everyone by selecting appropriate attire.

Procedures for Guest Passes

In order for a Sam Barlow student to bring a non-Barlow date to Snowball or Prom, a guest pass form must be completed and **turned in to an assistant principal for approval by 3:30 pm the Wednesday before the dance**. For this year's Snowball, that **deadline will be Wednesday, November 30**. Assistant principals need at least 24 hours to process the guest pass once it is submitted. It is then the student's job to return and pick it up. The **completed** guest pass must be presented at the time the ticket is purchased during lunches the week of the dance. **Assistant principals will not process guest passes after the Wednesday, November 30, deadline.**

Guest pass forms are available in the main office starting Monday, November 14. By planning ahead, students wishing to bring a guest to Snowball have ample time to collect the necessary signatures. No guests younger than 9th grade or 21 and older are permitted at Barlow dances. In addition, **faxing** the form to or from our school office **is not allowed**. It is the student's responsibility to obtain the required signatures.

Reminder: No Tolerance Policy For Inappropriate Dancing
Students and parents are reminded that Freaking, Grinding, or other dancing of a sexual nature is not appropriate for dances at SBHS. There will be no warnings. Students who choose to dance in this manner **will be removed from the dance and sent home**. Repeated violations will result in loss of dance privileges.

MEChA Day of the Dead Altar Display

Sugar skulls, traditional food and drinks are things you might find on the altars built to attract those who’ve passed away back for a visit. The altars are built in homes and around tombstones and they represent “el Día de los Muertos,” or Day of the Dead. It is a tradition that was developed by the Aztecs in Mexico about 3000 years ago and celebrated on November 1 (for the “angels” or deceased children) and November 2 (for deceased adults).

The Aztecs believed one should not grieve the loss of a loved one, but instead, celebrate their lives and welcome the return of their spirits once a year with their favorite food, drinks and even music. Everything on the altar has a special meaning.

Some of the items are:

Sugar skulls: The colorful designs represent the vitality of life and individual personality.

Food: The deceased person’s favorite meals are placed on the altar as offerings for their return.

Pan de Muerto: Semisweet breads are baked in the shape of bones and dusted with sugar and represent the soil.

Photographs: Images of loved ones who have died.

Papel picado: Delicately decorated tissue paper representing the wind and fragility of life.

Candles: Representing fire and a light to guide them back to visit the land of the living.

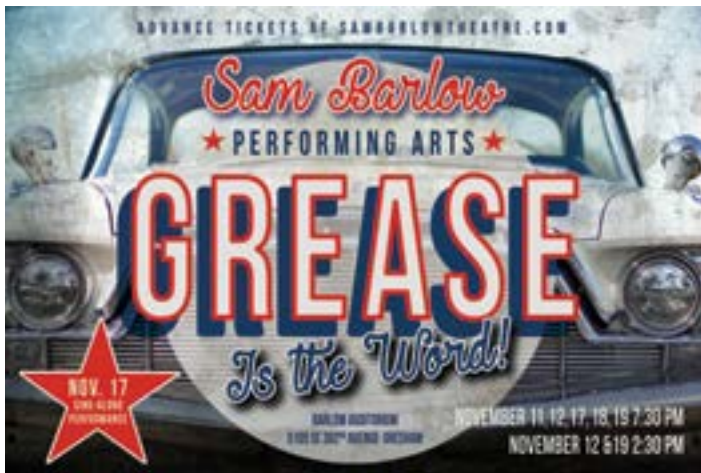

Ryan is an alumnus of Sam Barlow High School and earned his gold medal in the shot put with an Olympic record throw. Sam Crouser competed in the javelin and is an alumnus of Gresham High School. The two men are cousins and come from a family with a rich tradition in the throwing events. Both young men came and talked to the student body about their Olympic experience and the 2016 Rio Olympics, in general. The most impactful part of their presentation was how they both communicated that hard work, perseverance, and the support of family were huge in their athletic successes and also in the classroom as students at their respective schools and universities.



Oregon Promise

The Oregon Promise: Go to college for almost free! The Oregon Promise application is open online! This is a funding bill available to Oregon students planning to attend an Oregon Community College. Funds will be available to students with a 2.5GPA or above, who have completed grade 12 in Oregon, have done their FAFSA and who apply before March 1. Funds will be a minimum of \$1000 per student, up to a maximum of approximately \$3400 per year. To learn more about the Oregon Promise, go to: www.oregonpromise.org

This is a list of over 500 scholarships open to Oregon students from which they may choose up to 40 and apply with one online application. The OSAC Scholarship is open from Nov. 1 through March 1. Don DeLillo is the author of 16 novels, a novella, a collection of short stories, several plays, and a screenplay. *The New York Review of Books* famously dubbed him the “Chief shaman of the paranoid school of American fiction,” and a fellow giant of the American canon, Philip Roth, has praised the “combination of terror and comedy and sheer song” in DeLillo’s work. His many honors include the National Book Award (*White Noise*), the Pen/Faulkner Award (*Mao II*), the Jerusalem Prize, the Library of Congress Prize for American Fiction, the William Dean Howells Medal from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, the Carl Sandburg Literary Award, and the National Book Foundation’s Medal for Distinguished Contribution to American Letters.

Noah Hawley is an Emmy, Golden Globe, and Peabody Award-winning author, screenwriter, and producer. He has published four novels, most recently *Before the Fall* (Grand Central Publishing, 2016). Hawley is currently an executive producer, writer, and showrunner of FX’s award-winning series, *Fargo*, and is adapting Don DeLillo’s *Zero K* for film.

Dance Team NEWS

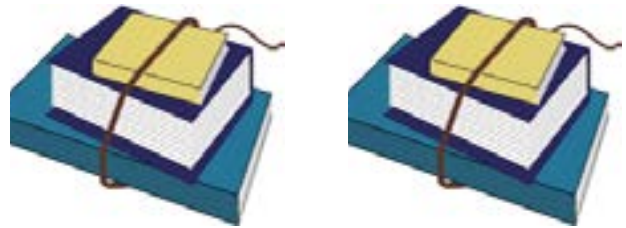

Health News from our Nurse

Flu Season is just around the Corner

It's almost that time of year, folks: fevers, coughing, and those terrible body aches; I am of course talking about the perennial favorite, the flu. But worry not, dear reader, because you can get immunized against the flu! Don't like shots? Well you can try the new flu mist, it is no worse than a nasal spray and may save your life (and certainly your weekend).

Now I know what you are thinking, "I get the flu shot every year and I get sick anyway!" – While getting the shot does not eliminate the chance of getting the flu completely, most likely what you had was a cold; what's the difference? Let me have the Centers for Disease Control explain it:

"The flu and the common cold are both respiratory illnesses but they are caused by different viruses. Because these two types of illnesses have similar flu-like symptoms, it can be difficult to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone. In general, the flu is worse than the common cold, and symptoms such as fever, body aches, extreme tiredness, and dry cough are more common and intense. Colds are usually milder than the flu. People with colds are more likely to have a runny or stuffy nose. Colds generally do not result in serious health problems, such as pneumonia, bacterial infections, or hospitalizations."-CDC

Ah, but some of you are saying, "I don't get sick usually, and I'll take my chances with the flu. I could use the time off anyway!" Well, to that I do have one last thing for you to consider; there are people out there who are unable to get the flu shot due to problems with their immune system. If you get the flu shot, you can help reduce the chance that they will catch it (from you in this case) which may well save their life and certainly will make their already difficult life easier. Consider it a good deed, doing your part to make somebody's life that much better. If you have any other questions, look at the Oregon Department of Public Health or CDC websites, or simply talk to your doctor or school nurse.
