The SAT deadline for the January 23 test is December 28. Apply online at www.collegeboard.org. The ACT deadline for the February 6 test is January 8. Apply online at www.actstudent.org. Barlow's school code is: 380432. Be sure to list 4 (free) schools you wish to receive your scores. If you don't choose schools at the time of registration, you will need to pay \$12 per school when you later request to have your scores sent to colleges.

College and Career News

December is here!

This is a **huge** milestone for seniors who are college bound. The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is a necessary component for colleges and scholarships. Although you cannot apply for the FAFSA until **after** January 1, 2016, now is the time for **both student and parents** to go online to each apply for the FSA ID number. Go to www.StudentAid.gov/fsaid. This number will allow you to sign your FAFSA electronically and later access your processed FAFSA student aid report. Remember, your FSA ID will stay with the student and parent(s) for all four years of college. So, keep it in a safe place! Go to www.fafsa.gov for more information.

ASPIRE's informational meeting about Financial Aid and the FAFSA will be held *Tuesday, Dec. 8th in the Barlow Auditorium (English version) and Little Theater (Spanish version) at 6:30pm.* Juniors, seniors and parents are encouraged to attend to get first hand information about your FAFSA, how to plan ahead and what to expect.

There are now online student financial aid estimators called *Net Price Calculators*. - Go to: <http://netpricecalculator.collegeboard.org/> or to your college's website to research their net price calculator. Enter your family's specific financial situation and get an estimate of your financial aid awards and the cost of college. Or, you can also file the *FAFSA4Caster* on the fafsa.gov website.

Juniors & Seniors:

Have you created your "*All About Me*" binder yet?

If you are planning to attend college or a trade school and/or apply for scholarships, you will want to get yourself organized. Your senior year is packed full of time consuming commitments. If you get your things in order now, life will be so much easier later.

1. Get a 3" binder. Start accumulating and organizing information about you and your accomplishments.
2. In the binder, include: copies of official transcripts, letters of recommendation, copies of awards and certificates, a graded paper of which you are proud, records of your financial aid account names and passwords, SAT and ACT scores, copies of your senior photo, your activity chart/resume and photos of you doing the things you do in your free time (like community service.)
3. Put your materials in plastic sleeves to keep them neat and organized.
4. Keep this binder in a SAFE place where you can access it quickly when a scholarship or college opportunity arises.
5. Purchase a thumb drive and keep copies of application essays and college information on it. Keep this item with you at school so you are able to work on applications in the College & Career Center. There are materials for you to use in the CCC if you need them.

Seniors with a 2.5 GPA: You should all be registering for the new **Oregon Promise**, Oregon's free tuition application for community colleges in Oregon. The application requires that you file your FAFSA (after Jan. 1, 2016), that you have a GPA of 2.5 or better and that you plan to attend a community college within 6 months of graduation. The application is open from Nov. 1 – March 1. If you plan to attend a 4-year university, make this option your safety net. This opportunity could mean thousands of dollars of free tuition to you. Notes from the Nurse

Vaccination season is almost upon us, and I feel it's a great time to discuss some of the concerns about vaccinations; many people worry about the safety of vaccinations, and while I cannot cover everything, today I'm going to cover some of the common issues raised. "I have heard some vaccination ingredients are toxic."

Everything in life, including water, can be toxic in high enough doses. However, all toxic substances in vaccinations are far, far below the level needed to cause harm in a child.

The top three substances most people worry about are: Mercury (Which is also found in breast milk, and it was removed completely from most childhood vaccines, including the measles vaccine, in 2001.), formaldehyde (Which is also produced naturally in the body) and aluminum (Which is present in many foods and water. In fact, vaccines with aluminum in them typically contain only 1% of the average amount of aluminum a person takes in every day!).

"Can you get the disease from the vaccine?"

Getting a disease from a vaccine is extremely rare; many vaccines are made with dead pathogens, which cannot get you sick. Live-pathogen vaccines can sometimes cause a mild version of the disease, which isn't dangerous and helps to show the vaccine is working. Historically, some vaccines have, in extremely rare cases, caused the disease they intend to prevent. This is, of course, tragic, and these vaccines are removed from care when identified. Even then, the risk of remaining unvaccinated far outweighs the risk of receiving one.

"The rates of many diseases we are vaccinated against are low, should I get one then?"

That the rates of these diseases are so low is due to the success of vaccination, but do you need one now? Think of it like a seatbelt or air bag in your car. You may go your whole life without getting into so much as a fender bender, but isn't it worth having the protection just in case? The same is true of vaccines.

"Vaccines are too expensive!"

It is sadly the case that many people don't have the resources for healthcare. If this is the case for you, contact me and I will help identify programs that can provide low cost, or potentially even free, vaccinations for you or your child.
